Visit Arromanches, Omaha Beach, the Normandy American Cemetery and other iconic sites associated with the pivotal World War II operation. Admire some of France's greatest treasures, including the magnificent Mont-Saint-Michel and renowned impressionist art by Degas, Monet and Renoir. Plus, you'll savor flavorful wines with lunch at a stately, 10th-century castle and sample Normandy's acclaimed Calvados apple cider brandy on an estate. Throughout your travels, experts share illuminating insights to enrich your experience.

Day 1 | Depart gateway city

AHI FlexAir passengers depart for Paris, France. Please check your luggage from your gateway city to your arrival city. Your claim checks should have the following airport code: CDG.

Day 2 Paris, France | Honfleur

Arrive at Paris Charles de Gaulle Airport. Proceed through immigration and then to the baggage claim area to retrieve your luggage. After completing customs, AHI FlexAir passengers traveling on flights that qualify for the group arrival transfer and Land Program passengers who have purchased seats on the group transfer should exit the baggage claim area and proceed to the Arrivals Hall, where an AHI Travel representative will meet you. The meeting location will be provided with your final documents.

Transfer and check in to the first-class Hôtel Mercure Honfleur, a picturesque harbor town on the Seine River estuary where it meets the English Channel. Please note that if you arrive before check-in time, your room may not be immediately available.

Welcome Reception & Dinner. This evening, meet fellow travelers at a Welcome Reception at the hotel, followed by dinner at one of Honfleur's outstanding restaurants, sampling the town's celebrated cuisine.

Day 3 | Honfleur

Enjoy a hearty breakfast at the hotel each morning and begin your day ready to explore.

Historic Honfleur Walking Tour. Set out on a guided walk through Honfleur, the quintessential French port town that has long inspired artists such as Claude Monet, Gustave Courbet and Eugène Boudin. In the mid-19th century, these painters were drawn to the harbor's fleeting interplay of light and color, setting up their easels near the hilltop Ferme Saint-Siméon. Working "en plein air," they captured the region's ephemeral beauty, giving rise to the École de Honfleur—a vibrant artists' colony whose innovative approach to landscape painting helped shape the Impressionist movement.

As you stroll, soak in the maritime charm of Honfleur's 17th-century Vieux Bassin, where the Seine meets the English Channel. Between the 16th and 18th centuries, the town flourished as a thriving trading port and a springboard for exploration—most notably, in 1608, when Samuel de Champlain set sail from Honfleur to found Quebec City. Walk along the colorful harbor, lined with tall, narrow timber-framed houses built by affluent families, each home proudly overlooking the bustling docks.

Wander the maze of side streets and squares, alive with cafés, galleries and artisan shops, and discover Honfleur's storied landmarks. Step inside the wooden Église Sainte-Catherine, crafted by 15th-century shipbuilders. Its striking inverted-boat-hull roof and hand-hewn timber construction, created without the use of saws, pay tribute to the town's enduring maritime heritage. (Moderate)

Free Time: Enjoy a leisurely lunch in Honfleur. The region boasts an enduring tradition of exceptional cheeses, nourished by the rich milk of Normande cows. Perhaps you'll sample world-renowned varieties, such as Camembert de Normandie, Neufchâtel and Pont-l'Évêque, paired with crusty bread and a glass of crisp, local apple cider.

ADA Continuing Education Seminar: Join the first session of your program.

Enrichment: The French Resistance. Delve into the origins of the French Resistance, learning about its leaders and the courageous patriots who fought to liberate their country.

This evening, reconvene with your fellow travelers for a delightful dinner at a local restaurant, reflecting on the day's discoveries and the town's enduring charm.

Day 4 | Honfleur | Arromanches | Omaha Beach | Colleville-sur-Mer | Pointe du Hoc

Enrichment: D-Day and the Battle of Normandy. On your drive to Arromanches, a local World War II expert will provide an illuminating lecture on Normandy's pivotal role in the Allied invasion. Gain a nuanced understanding of the strategic planning, heroic efforts and enduring legacy of the men and women who shaped this critical chapter in history.

D-Day and the Battle of Normandy . Depart the hotel by deluxe motorcoach and journey along Juno and Gold beaches, passing the quaint villages of Cabourg, Merville and Bénouville, and pausing at the iconic Pegasus Bridge. Arrive in Arromanches to explore the Landing Museum, perched above the remains of the Mulberry Harbour, an extraordinary feat of engineering that allowed thousands of troops, vehicles and tons of supplies to reach the beaches each day during Operation Overlord. Through carefully curated artifacts, photographs, documents and multimedia displays, step into the history and strategy of one of the most ambitious military operations in history.

Pause for a shared lunch at a local Arromanches restaurant, reflecting on the morning's discoveries.

Continue to Omaha Beach, where the sands bear witness to the extraordinary courage of Allied forces who advanced under devastating fire across heavily fortified shorelines. In Colleville-sur-Mer, visit the Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial, set on a serene bluff overlooking Omaha Beach, where 9,385 graves commemorate those who gave their lives in the invasion and subsequent battles, alongside a memorial garden honoring the missing in action. Conclude your day at Pointe du Hoc, where U.S. Rangers courageously scaled 100-foot cliffs to neutralize German artillery positions that threatened troops landing on Omaha and Utah beaches. (Active)

Return to Honfleur for dinner at your leisure. Choose from charming brasseries and waterfront restaurants renowned for fresh seafood and Norman cuisine. Your AHI Travel Director can provide recommendations.

Day 5 | Honfleur | Étretat | Upper Normandy

Étretat. Depart Honfleur for a scenic drive to the breathtaking coastal town of Étretat, crossing the iconic Pont de Normandie en route. Opened in 1995, the bridge is a masterpiece of modern design that exemplifies French civil engineering excellence and signals your approach to the coast. Arrive in the charming seaside town, tucked along a pebbly beach on France's northern coast. Étretat is renowned for its dramatic white cliffs, sculpted by nature into striking forms such as the Porte d'Aval arch and the famed Aiguille, known as the "Needle," a slender pillar rising from the sea. Bathed in ever-changing light, these luminous landscapes inspired Claude Monet and other Impressionist painters in the 19th century. Stroll the oceanfront promenade while taking in sweeping vistas of chalk cliffs, open sky and the vast Channel beyond. (Moderate)

Lunch is served on-site, a buffet of regional specialties accompanied by carefully selected local wines and beers, enjoyed amid the castle's serene park setting.

Château du Bec. Cross the graceful Pont de Normandie, its sweeping cable-stayed structure spanning the Seine, as you travel into Upper Normandy. Your first stop is the privately owned Château du Bec , a 10th-century castle set amid lush woodlands and waterways. Stroll the manicured grounds with one of the owners while discovering the castle's history along the way. (Moderate)

After the tour, return to Honfleur.

Day 6 | Honfleur | Mont-Saint-Michel

Le Mont-Saint-Michel . You won't soon forget your first glimpse of the spectacular Mont-Saint-Michel rising like an astounding mirage over the surrounding flat white sands. For centuries, pilgrims have made their way to the abbey perched atop the small granite island off the coast of Normandy. Today, embark on your own pilgrimage as you ascend to the UNESCO-inscribed Mont-Saint-Michel Abbey. Marvel at its Romanesque and Gothic architecture, learn about its centuries-long history as a fortress, monastery and prison, and reflect on its enduring symbolism of faith, resilience, and human ingenuity. (Active)

Free Time: Enjoy some leisure time on Mont-Saint-Michel. Find a spot for lunch on your own and then take in panoramic views from the ramparts, observe the shifting tides, meander through the lively streets and soak up the island's magical atmosphere.

Return to Honfleur and relax after your active day over dinner at leisure.

Day 7 | Caen | Honfleur

Le Mémorial de Caen. Begin your day at the Caen Memorial Museum, an award-winning institution that offers a compelling exploration of World War II, the D-Day landings, the Battle of Normandy, and the Cold War through informative exhibits, photographs and video footage. The museum presents an international perspective on the Second World War, highlighting its global consequences while emphasizing remembrance, reconciliation and peace. (Moderate)

AHI Connects | Norman Lunch & Calvados Tasting: Venture to Les Vergers de Ducy, a 42-acre estate regarded for its apple orchards and Calvados brandy. Savor a traditional Norman lunch and a tasting of the region's famed Calvados brandy, learning about the centuries-old craft of distillation and the nuanced flavors that make this apple brandy world-renowned. (Mild)

Return to Honfleur.

Day 8 | Honfleur

Optional visits include the Musée Eugène Boudin , which celebrates the local artist whose landscapes capture the charm of Normandy, or the Musée de la Marine , devoted to maritime history and seafaring traditions. Your AHI Travel Director will offer tailored suggestions for sightseeing, shopping and dining.

Farewell Reception and Dinner. Conclude your journey with a Farewell Reception at the hotel followed by a celebratory dinner at a local restaurant, sharing reflections and memories of Normandy's landscapes, history and culinary delights.

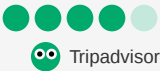
